The faculty team and students made it a pleasure to coordinate this semester.

### Conclusion of the study board

The Study Board (MSN) has processed the semester evaluation report and offers the following observations/conclusions:

- Student survey response rate: 13/56. This is quite low. Please note that it is the responsibility of the coordinator for the subsequent semester to ensure that students take the survey regarding the previous semester
- The semester appears to have run successfully
- The *Theory and Practice of Game Design and Development* receives very mixed feedback from students. It is a little rare to see much spread in student feedback for course modules. Lecturers and coordinators are encouraged to continue developing and refining the course and its implementation
