





The study board has on its meeting on the above data decided that there is no need for changes in the curriculum or its implementation. The level of the program is assessed to be high, as well as quality and amount of supervision received. There is expressed a wish to have more specialized courses, however given the amount of students following the program and the available resources, together with the rules on specialisations, it is not possible to increase the amount of specialized courses. Such comment has not been received during last years assessments and this year there are 3 students that are filled in the questionnaire and therefore it is unclear how general this comment is.
