
- Guest lectures were nice as they gave real life examples from the field.


- 11a. Possible comments on your own effort in the course For example: In which activity did you put the greatest effort? Why? In which activity did you put the least effort? Why?




- This course was incredibly informative and gave a pretty good overview of communication systems.




It was nice to have some company collaboration with a few Danish companies and I am also happy with our end result in the project.






